Paraguay: Field Director Julian Paredes suffers with pain in his left foot. It is difficult for him to walk. Please pray for the Lord to heal him.

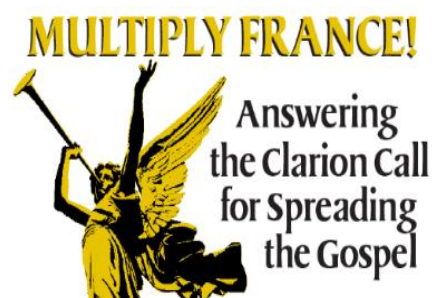
Nigeria: Field Director Okon Obot shared that they held their Open Bible Churches Pastoral Conference in Makurdi, the state capital of the Benue province, from January 24-26, 2025. It was preceded by four days of national fasting and prayer during the first week of January in all their churches. The theme of the Conference was “Awakening for Transformation”. Pastor Okon said the program was very successful and over 60 pastors attended.

On their way back to Calabar, one of the vehicles that was transporting Pastor Okon and some of the Open Bible pastors, broke down in the middle of the road just 10 kilometers from the city of Ogoja. While they were wondering what to do next, suddenly a team of motor-mechanics stopped and asked if they needed help. The mechanics worked on the vehicle for three hours and fixed it. They were able to return to the headquarter church in Calabar.



We all believe it to be a miracle of the Lord because without the mechanics showing up, Pastor Okon and the other pastors would not have made it back to Calabar that day. The car broke down more than 400 kilometers away from the city of Calabar. As it says in Matthew 28:20, “And, I am with you always, even unto the end of the world.” When we obey Him and “go”, He will go with us and make sure we are protected.
