



Prayer and Praise – April 08, 2026

Guinea: On Tuesday, April 7th, Missionaries Tom and Sherry Moore began their final trip to Kamsar, where they would spend three weeks working on building projects in Madina Borboffe and Kawass, as well as completing the interior of the new church in Bigori.



About an hour and a half outside of Conakry, their motor suddenly stopped, even though it had just been replaced the previous week. It initially appeared to be a blockage in the fuel line, preventing fuel from reaching the engine. After waiting on the side of the road, mechanics arrived approximately an hour and a half later. Within fifteen minutes, they discovered that the electrical wires connected to the fuel pump had come loose for unknown reasons.

They were soon back on the road, and everything was running smoothly. They gave thanks to the Lord for His protection and provision and expressed deep gratitude.

The Lord continues to do miraculous things through their work. Despite the challenges they have faced, as the enemy is not happy, they remain confident that God will accomplish all that He has purposed for Guinea.

Cuba: Open Bible family in Cuba ask for prayer for their country. Cuba is facing a lack of resources and many challenges. Please pray that the Lord will provide and that He will give our pastors and leaders faith and strength to continue the ministry in the midst of uncertainty.

Field Director David Moreno’s assistant, Yaimelys Toste shared, “We would like to share a miracle we witnessed in our church. A baby was diagnosed in his mother’s womb with only one arterial valve in his heart. The doctors advised the mother to have an abortion because the baby was not expected to survive. However, she chose to trust God and continued with the pregnancy.



After the baby was born, doctors said he needed heart surgery before one month of age or he could die. In Cuba, this surgery was not available. The family began to pray and believe God for a miracle. Today, the baby is alive and doing well without the surgery. He is now two months old. Although doctors say he could pass away at any time, the family presented him at church to glorify God’s name for the blessings in the midst of challenges.”



Liberia: Field Director Hilary Paul shared, “The *Voice of Open Bible* weekly radio broadcast was officially launched and dedicated to God on Wednesday, April 1, 2026, on ELWA Radio at 8:00 p.m. This is the first exclusive radio program of the denomination in more than seventy years. Its purpose is to spread the Gospel of Christ, share our vision (making disciples, developing leaders, and planting churches), provide biblical teaching, and advance our church planting efforts.

On Easter Sunday, April 5, 2026, our churches also launched and dedicated both the Radio and Coconut projects. Senior pastors, with the support of church boards and congregations, led these special programs. Prayers were offered, messages were shared, and funds were raised to support these initiatives. One of our pastors served as the host on the first broadcast.

We have been able to pay for the first three months of airtime, and are trusting God for the continued sustainability of the program, and for the opportunity to expand from 30 minutes per week to 45 minutes or even one hour.”

Tijuana, Mexico: Missionaries Justus and Michaela Morgan and Zac Anderson shared, “At the end of March, we had the privilege of hosting Creekside Christian School from Rapid City, South Dakota. During their time with us, they worked diligently to build a home for a very special family. This family has endured so much. Eight years prior, the father suffered a stroke, and shortly afterward, his wife left, leaving him to raise and care for their four children, who are now teenagers. Despite these immense challenges, God has remained faithful.



The family was incredibly grateful to the Lord and to the team for their new home. We praise Jesus for a safe and richly blessed week, and for the love and compassion shown through Creekside Christian School.

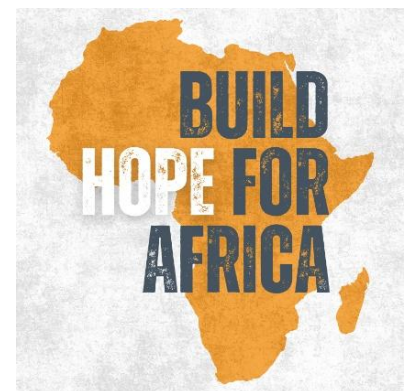
