Japan: This week and next, Japan Open Bible Churches will be celebrating their 70th anniversary. Currently, there are 20 Open Bible churches in Japan, and the vision is to see that number grow to 30 churches by the year 2030.

The property covers 1,000 square meters, and the church building will be approximately 800 square meters—once completed, it will be the largest Open Bible church in the Mindanao area!"

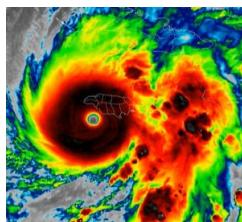

Puente de Amistad: MOVE Ministries Director Aaron Keller shared that MOVE recently completed a major project at Puente de Amistad in Tijuana, Mexico. A dedicated crew of 20 men from across the United States joined forces with the missionaries and staff to remove the old roofing and install new materials across most of the facility.



The project was a resounding success, not only restoring the structure but significantly impacting the lives of the men involved. This beautifully aligned with our theme of “Renewal,” encompassing both its physical and spiritual dimensions – the physical transformation of the building and a spiritual renewal in the lives of the men who served.

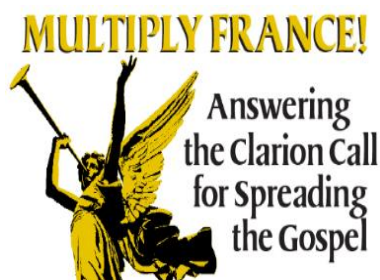
